UPDATE

We are all aware of the explosion that took place in Regina Beach on December 3, 2014, it is a day people will talk about for a long time. Our thoughts are with those effected and hope there is positive outcome to this frightening event.

SaskEnergy has been working diligently within Regina Beach and the surrounding area to ensure that all gas connections are safe. Surveyors have been also assigned to other areas most affected by movement around Last Mountain Lake.

In a recent meeting with Council, SaskEnergy representatives outlined the following:

- Buena Vista's natural gas infrastructure was installed starting 1991.
- The design installed included for ground movement, using a combination of steel gas mains and polyethylene plastic service lines to homes.
- There are 13 expansion loops contained in concrete vaults within the Village which reduce the impact of ground movement on the system.
- Approximately every 2 to 3 days, SaskEnergy are using leak survey technicians, both on foot and using vehicle mounted detectors to regularly monitor the community for possible leaks.
- As a result of these surveys SaskEnergy repaired one underground leak in the Village due to ground shifting.

BYLAWS

- The Village of Buena Vista does not allow the setting off of fireworks within the limits of the Village without first obtaining a permit. A copy of the Bylaw and request for permit is available at the Village office.
- All dogs have to be licensed. These are available at the Village office for \$5.00 and have to be renewed January every year.
- No motorized vehicles are allowed in Dobson Park or Lion's Park.
- Our noise Bylaw states that no person shall make, or continue to make, or cause to be made, or allow to be made, or allow to be continued to be made, any loud noise, or any unnecessary noise, or any unusual noise between the hours of 11pm and 7am. Please be considerate of your neighbours.
- Before you carry out any work in or around your property check if you need a permit.
